September Meeting Tuesday, September 9, 2025

There have been at least three, perhaps four waves of opioid overdose deaths in the U.S. The first followed increasing prescriptions of natural and semi-synthetic opioids and methadone since 1999. The second began in 2010 with rapid increases in heroin-involved overdose deaths. The third began in 2013 with significant increases in overdose deaths involving synthetic opioids, especially fentanyl. Fentanyl, Carfentanil and Zylazine (a horse tranquilizer) mixed with heroin and methamphetamine are among the newest drugs showing up in overdose deaths with fentanyl garnering the most attention. Over several years opioid deaths have been decreasing. The first federal funded "narcotics farm" (NARCO), home to the Addition Research Center, was established in Lexington in 1935. Research conducted at ARC has served as a foundation for basic science and clinical drug research from the mid-1930s to the present. Over the past 90 years researchers at UK have played critical roles in the scientific communities studying how to prevent and effectively treat drug abuse and dependence. Our speakers for the UKAEF meeting on September 9, 2025 continue that tradition.



Dr. Carrie Oser is Professor in the Department of Behavioral Science in the College of Medicine. Her BA is from UK and her MA and PhD are from the University of Georgia.



Dr. April Young has a BA from Transylvania University, her MPH from UK and a PhD from Emory. In 2021 she was named a University Research Professor.

In 2019 the National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA) and the National Institute of Neurological Disorders and Strokes (NINDS) funded (\$343.7M) the largest addiction prevention and treatment implementation study ever conducted. Teams from UK, Boston Medical Center, Columbia University, Ohio State and a coordinating Center at RTI conducted the 4-year, community randomized study in 67 communities, 16 of which were in Kentucky. Oser and Young were members of the 24-member leadership team at UK led by Professor Sharon Walsh from Behavioral Science in the College of Medicine. Professors Oser and Young will talk about the study and what it revealed about attempts to reduce opioid overdose deaths in the U.S. and in Kentucky.

As we begin a new academic year, I look forward to working with you to strengthen UKAEF and increase our visibility among UK leadership, faculty, and the broader university community.

Appreciation for Tom Janoski

Please join me in thanking Past-President Tom Janoski for his outstanding leadership and dedication over the past year. Tom has been a strong advocate for emeriti and professional retirees, representing us effectively with the UK Administration, the UK Alumni Association, and other campus organizations. I am pleased that Tom will continue to serve on the Executive Committee.

Meeting with Deans Bush and Stevenson

On June 16, VP - Programs Dick Clayton and I met with Dean Heather Bush (College of Public Health) and Dean Laura Stephenson (College of Agriculture, Food and Environment). We discussed the experience and strengths of our members, and how we as a group could help them achieve their goals. The Deans responded very positively and agreed to make a joint presentation to UKAEF at our February 10 meeting.

"Issues in Higher Education" Speaker Series

One idea that emerged from our discussion with the Deans—originally proposed by Lee Todd and Meri Hackbart—is a university-wide speaker series on pressing issues in higher education. As a starting point, we suggested an event on "The Future of Higher Education Among Land-Grant Institutions," led by the two colleges with UKAEF as a co-sponsor. The Deans expressed strong interest, and we agreed to begin developing a formal proposal.

Membership Outreach

- 1. Outreach to Retirees: We will ask Deans and Department Chairs to notify us of upcoming retirements in their colleges/departments. We will then extend personal invitations to those retirees to join UKAEF.
- 2. Membership Incentive: I am always in favor of good food! Thanks to two anonymous donors, we will offer three \$100 gift certificates to top-tier Lexington restaurants to the three members who recruit the most new members over the next year.
